## **SUPPORT**

The League of Women Voters of Oregon's Election Laws position (1997) "recognizes that election procedures and voter information are critical elements to an informed and participating electorate." Our Elections Method position (2017) further "recognizes that election methods affect how voters participate in our democracy, who can run for office, and who can get elected." The rules and procedures for conducting and counting such elections need to accommodate all elections in Oregon.

The LWVOR supports SB 44, with the -4 amendment. The dash 4 amendment would responsively change the statutes to readily accommodate the newer electoral method of Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) already in place in some jurisdictions.

Current law is either silent or does not correctly address vote recounts, tallying or write-in votes when using the RCV method for electing either single or multiple winners. Further, the amendment also adds an official definition of Ranked Choice Voting to Oregon statutes for future needs.

The bill does *not* require any jurisdiction to adopt the RCV system. Yet, it sets up processes for addressing it in the areas of Oregon which might adopt RCV or which already use it, namely: Benton County, Multnomah County, and the cities of Corvallis and Portland. All of those jurisdictions, currently with RCV elections, are governed by state law. State law should be modernized to include the vote counting, recounting and tallying procedures for all elections, including those using Ranked Choice Voting.
